GILLINGHAM PC UPDATE

Monthly Meeting October 2019

Parish Ten (parishioners’ slot) – Information was requested regarding the current situation regarding the new houses on The Street. The only new information was that the decision from the planning committee was now scheduled for 21st October.

21 October, the date originally chosen for the Litter Pick, was rather early, suggested Mrs Black, and might better be postponed. Litter would be easier to spot once the leaves were off the trees and some of the undergrowth had died back. She proposed Saturday 7 December as the new date, working from 9.30 am to 12.00 noon followed by festive refreshments – watch out for the posters in November.

Village Matters – There is an ongoing dialogue with the Village Hall Committee about the walnut tree on Village Hall land which is hindering the view from the bus stop.

The dog-waste bin has again come loose from the wall. Cllr Massingham said he would put it back and try to improve the fitting which is too close to the drainpipe and wall.

Due to the uneven surface of the playing field the old goal net has been removed. The gate has also been bolted together.

Basic Life Support with the East Anglian Air Ambulance



On Thursday 3 October, Kirby Cane & Ellingham Parish Council welcomed 14 people to a very interesting training session at Kirby Cane Memorial Hall on basic life support and the use of a defibrillator. The training was led by Doug Penry, a volunteer with the East Anglian Air Ambulance (EAAA).

Over 40% of EAAA callouts involve cardiac arrest, Doug told the participants, and he stressed how important cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) was in keeping patients alive while waiting for the emergency services to arrive. Everyone had a chance to practice the CPR technique on the mannequins Doug had brought with him, and realised how tricky it can be, for example, to achieve the correct amount of pressure to give worthwhile chest compressions.

It was useful to have a closer look at the defibrillator, which is housed in a yellow cabinet on the front of the Memorial Hall. During an emergency call, 999/112 operators talk members of the public through the steps they must follow when dealing with a cardiac arrest. The defibrillator itself is automated and will give instructions at each stage. It was helpful to be able to see the unit, nonetheless, and be told, in calm and unpressurised circumstances, how it should be used in an emergency.

The session helped to demystify the CPR process, and all present were glad to hear that, as of next year, all secondary school children will be taught these important techniques.

The Parish Council is very grateful to Doug Penry and the EAAA for providing this training, and for all the work the organisation does across our region - it is a charitable body and relies wholly on donations to keep operating throughout the year.

Remembrance Sunday

10 November 2019

In Ellingham ...

The joint Remembrance service for all the Waveney Group parishes will take place at St Mary's church in Ellingham at 10 am on Sunday, 10 November.

Sixteen names are listed on the War Memorial in the churchyard. On a pillar inside the church hang not one but two Rolls of Honour. These offer more information about those named outside. Two of the Cosseys were already enrolled in the regular army before 1914, for instance; both were corporals.



One Roll of Honour lists a further 48 men from the parish of Ellingham who served in the armed forces during the Great War. Fourteen were wounded, five were gassed, three were taken prisoner, two were blinded and others were "shell-shocked". The names of certain families crop up time and again: Hood, Thrower, Barber, Snowling, Spalding, Baldry ...

A second Roll of Honour hangs on the same pillar. It lists 53 employees of W.D. & A.E. Walker who served during the First World War (two were killed). Walkers were maltsters in Bungay who owned Ellingham Mill and were major employers in the area.

... and Loddon.

The Loddon & District branch of the Royal British Legion will hold its annual Poppy Stall on Church Plain in Loddon from Monday to Friday, 4-8 November (10.00 am and 4.00 pm), and on Saturday 9 November (10.00 am to 12.00 noon).

A short service at the War Memorial on Sunday, 10 November will be followed by another in Holy Trinity Church. On Armistice Day, Monday 11 November, the usual parade will pass through the village.

The RBL's Haddiscoe branch (1936-2007)

The Haddiscoe branch of the British Legion was set up for local ex-servicemen in 1936 at a meeting hosted in the library of Haddiscoe Hall by Colonel Freeland, its first president. Thereafter branch members met periodically at the Three Tuns or the Dun Cow, Aldeby's two pubs.

During World War Two members of the Legion were active in their support for the war effort, fundraising and sending comfort boxes for those in the armed forces. A comfort box might contain knitted socks and balaclavas; it often included cigarettes and chocolate, obtained by members pooling their ration coupons. Wartime fundraising in cities like Birmingham

accumulated enough to pay for a Spitfire or an armoured car. Our villages set themselves more modest targets: they aimed to cover the cost of a machine gun. Many of the Legion's members, naturally, also served in the Home Guard.



After the war ended in 1945, men from Geldeston and Gillingham joined their fellow ex-servicemen from Haddiscoe, Aldeby, Burgh St Peter and Wheatacre – war veterans from Kirby Cane and Ellingham came under the Legion's

Bungay branch – and in 1950 the Legion reached its peak membership of three million. At a national level, the organisation, set up in 1921, was given a Royal Charter in 1925 and after the Second World War George VI's wife, the future Queen Mother, became its patron. In due course, Queen Elizabeth II succeeded her mother in that post.

The original standard of the Legion, carried between 1947 and 2007 by **Gordon Howlett**, today hangs in Aldeby church. The present standard-bearer is **Jonathan Sayer** from Geldeston who was the Haddiscoe branch secretary after 1987. In that year the branch had 57 members. Two years earlier the branch received a pennant to mark its 50th anniversary and this was stitched to its standard.

One activity of the post-war years was delivering Christmas boxes to elderly and disabled members who could not attend meetings. **Dougie Sayer** took over the task from **Bob Cook**; both were Geldeston men. The poppy appeal organiser in those days was **William Hubbard** from Aldeby, and **Leonard Simpson** from Gillingham was membership secretary. By 2007 only eight members survived and Haddiscoe became a sub-branch of Loddon.

I was never conscripted into the army, as was the case with my father or my Uncle Peter, nor did I become a professional soldier like my brother and grandson. For the past 34 years I have been a member of the Royal British Legion to help those who fought in the wars of the 20th century and in remembrance of several generations of my family who served and continue to serve with the country's armed forces.

The saints of the past unite us

Thought for the Month



St Mary's church in Gillingham has Saxon foundations, dating back to the 10th century AD, a time when all Christian churches were united in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church, stretching from Jerusalem to Africa, to Asia and to Europe and Britain.

In many ways, Eastern Orthodoxy resembles the medieval Church of the British Isles with its many saints and monasteries. That is why the Romanian Orthodox community, now worshipping at St Mary's, chose the Venerable Bede of Jarrow as its patron saint along with St Philothea, a martyr from the East. Centuries apart and geographically distant, each in their own way they represent one and the same spirituality. Together they come under the 'veil' of the Virgin Mary, to whom the church in Gillingham is dedicated, and who is especially revered and celebrated in the Orthodox tradition. Those three holy figures, I believe, unite us and take us back to our ancient and shared Christian roots.

Among our prayers at every service for the people of Gillingham, we remember fondly the founders of this holy church and other benefactors; and we pray for the souls of those at rest, awaiting the Lord's glorious Second Coming. The chain of prayer continues unbroken at St Mary's church, on behalf of, and together with, the people of Gillingham.
